


LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER DEATHS 01/01/2022-05/31/2022


This is a graphic presentation of data regarding line-of-duty deaths, both felonious and accidental, collected from law enforcement agencies across the United States and U.S. territories by the FBI's Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted Data Collection. This preliminary information is provided for officer safety studies, training, and other initiatives. The data are also published annually in the Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted publication.

KEY OBSERVATIONS

The 20 law enforcement officers feloniously killed in the first five months of 2022 represent a 39.4 percent decrease compared to the 33 officers killed during the same period in 2021. Firearms were used in 18 of the 20 felonious deaths in 2022, while 2 deaths involved the use of vehicles as weapons. The leading circumstances surrounding officers' deaths included activities related to ambushes on officers (6), disorder/disturbances (4), investigative/enforcement (3), and unprovoked attacks on officers (3). To date, there have been no occurrences of multiple officers feloniously killed during a single incident or due to a single offender's actions in 2022. Accidental law enforcement deaths decreased 3.7 percent when comparing the first five months of 2022 (26) with those of 2021 (27). The accidental deaths in 2022 were due to motor vehicle accidents (16), pedestrian officers being struck by vehicles (7), an accidental firearm-related incident (1), a fall (1), and an airplane crash (1). The sharp rise in accidental deaths witnessed in the first quarter of 2022 have leveled off and returned to rates of accidental deaths consistent with previous years. The southern region has the most law enforcement deaths in 2022 with 22 deaths total (9 felonious, 13 accidental). Although not represented in the below graphic, 57 officers have died from the following medical conditions in 2022: 50 law enforcement officers died in the line of duty from illnesses related to COVID-19, 4 officers died due to heart attacks, and 3 officers died due to other natural causes.




