## Program Description

In 2007, Florida Attorney General Pam Bondi's Cyber-Safety Education Program debuted at middle and high schools across the state. During the interactive 50-minute PowerPoint-based presentation, students learn about the risks of and tactics used by online predators as well as what constitutes a cyber crime and how to report it. The program is presented by specially-trained members of the Attorney General's team.

The CyberSafety Education Program was developed by the Attorney General's Child Predator CyberCrime Unit using information from the nationally-recognized program NetSmartz, research and assistance from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, and input from therapists and psychologists.

The Attorney General's CyberSafety Education Program has been endorsed by the Florida Department of Education, the Florida School Board Association, the Florida Association of School Administrators, the Florida Association of District School Superintendents, the Florida School Resource Officers Association, the Florida Police Chiefs Association and the Florida Sheriffs Association.

## Who is Eligible?

All middle and high schools, public and private, in the state of Florida.

## How do I sign up?

Your school principal received a unique password via mail. Log onto [www.safeflorida.net/safeschools](http://www.safeflorida.net/safeschools), find your county on the drop-down menu, find your school, and use the password to schedule a presentation.

## How can I get a new password?

If you need a replacement password, contact the CyberSafety Education Program office.

## What is needed for the presentations?

Equipment capable of running a PowerPoint presentation: laptop, LCD projector, a projector screen to view the presentation, speakers, and/or a sound system. Our presenters can bring their own equipment if needed.
