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Attorney General Bill McCollum: Okay, Do you like, do you like this girl, how many how many, what do you think? Guys, just guys vote is this an attractive young girl? You think so?

Child: No.

Child: Hell yea.

Attorney General Bill McCollum: Well somebody think so, right? Okay, let's take the next picture. This guy, this man posted her picture. His name is Paul Parker. He is the attorney in Bay County. He is the one that went online and pretended to be that girl. He is the one that I mention to when we were waiting on that video to come up a while ago who pretended to be that girl. And he "wound up" luring the 11 teenage boys to make the video cam. Explicit stuff he downloaded okay. It wasn't him at all. This is him now, he is in prison that what he look like. That's who you could be talking to. Paul Parker, Paul Parker instead of the girl you thought it was. So don't trust the picture, or don't trust the information given to you that a stranger puts up there that you don't really know. Let's go to the next one. Look at this, this is Danny. It's not easy to read with the lights somewhat on and you aren't going to be able to read all of this, but this is Danny's profile. He put this up on MySpace. Danny put this up and it looks like anybody else's profile and he says that he poetry, plants, flowers, watching movies by the fire. Very romantic right? Let's see there's some more of it. Danny loves his country; he's her for dating, serious relationships, friends, networking. So far he has already has 14 friends listed. This looks like an ordinary every day MySpace site. Well let's look at another site that Danny has, this is, the one back go back to that one. Well let's look at another site; this is umm well that's alright go ahead go ahead to the next one. This is Danny looking for a girlfriend. It says that but look at the tattoos that are up there okay. We're going to come back to that one in a minute. Now let's go into the next one. I want to show you the other site he has. Look at the other site that belongs to Danny. This is in Arizona; this is where Danny is a registered sex offender. Okay, he looked like when he had a MySpace site just like he had an ordinary one like you. Now you probably won't notice this but those tattoo was made in prison and probably the police department here the sheriff deputy make recognize that. There are certain ones that you don't see tattoos very often unless they are made in prison and he had it on his arms. He said that he's looking for a girlfriend, etc, etc. That's the danger people post stuff out there and they could be a know sex predator and unknown sex predator. Let's move on that is his other website, as I mentioned to you, in Arizona because that's where it is posted and where he was wanted at that time in that whole scheme of things. This video is impressive and let's look at it. [Pause] I guess I got there too fast, that's alright. We sometimes get ahead of ourselves. This is integrated into the system, but it didn't work as well today as we would like. But this should this should pop up.

Child: The internet it's a tool that has to be used properly. You know it like a knife, I mean it's very it's very helpful but it can also cut you. My name is Julie. When I was 13, I started talking to Tom. He didn't act or even sound like a 56 years old man. So he was different on the computer. I know that I wasn't supposed to be talking to him, but I did out of retaliation against my parents. It felt nice to have someone who wasn't always trying to tell you what to do. It started to get more like relationship where it went from just friends to best friends, more personal relationship then back to best friends. I would instant message him between three and six hours a day. I was really upset whenever I couldn't get on the internet because I knew he would be like, "What were you doing?" When email me like 10 times wondering where I was at, I'll feel extremely bad about it. It was an opportunity for him to manipulate more. I trusted him more than anybody else. He mentioned wouldn't it be nice if we were together all the time and then it came up of running away. The night left I kissed all my bothers good night and he was in his truck and he just rode out and I ran away for three weeks. The day that I was found we was on our way to Reno. Someone reported us and saw our truck. I knew pretty much it's over and I never really thought the day would come. He's going to be in jail for 25 years. He sent a letter to me saying that it was my fault and that he was going to kill me if he ever got out of jail. I was really upset because he didn't say anything about caring about me. I didn't think of his background and I didn't apply it to myself. So maybe he could have done anything to me, even kill me and so now that I'm back I feel like there's this huge emptiness inside of me. If I could have talked to people maybe I would have had a different view some things. If you're planning to run away it doesn't help solve anything, it makes it worst. Little things can end up becoming a big thing. I kind of wish that I never would have run away in the first place. I would never do it again.

I think that video pretty much says it all, umm but the bad guys can be anybody and you don't want to walk out the door that lets meet in real life is exactly what that little girl did. And they're not want they seem to be, there are predators they promise the things they want. The love, the romance, those kinds of things, that's what she talking about. Some kids are lonely and some of you have lots of friends. Some of you think that, but think about it this way you can find friends and communicate with them, friend in the sense of the internet, without haven't going to try to meet them in real life.
