### HOLDING THE OFFICE OF COUNTY TREASURER AND POST MASTER.

Tallahassee, Fla., January 16, 1913.

Dear Sir:—

Yours of the 14th inst. has been received and noted. My opinion is that the constitutional provision quoted in the Governor's letter to you, namely: "No person holding or exercising the functions of any office \* \* \* under the government of the United States \* \* \* shall hold any office of honor or profit under the government of this State," would prohibit your "exercising the functions" of Postmaster at Blountstown, as Assistant Postmaster, and, at the same time holding the office of County Treasurer of Calhoun County.
