

Dear Sir:

I acknowledge receipt of your letter of September 11 and note what you say about a case against William Miles, a negro undertaker of Perry who is now confined in the State prison at Raiford, Florida, on a charge of manslaughter.


It would not be possible for me to communicate with Miles by telephone and it would necessitate a trip to Raiford for that purpose. My fee for making the trip and investigating the case will be \$100.00. If you care to have me do this you can send me the money and I will investigate the case as early as possible, however, Circuit Court convenes in Citrus County on September 17 and I will be busy almost continuously for two or three weeks. The only day I could go to Raiford for this purpose would be on Sunday September 22. If this meets with your approval and you care to advance the fee mentioned herein I will make the trip for you.

After I have investigated the case I will make a report to you and advise you what fee I will charge for undertaking to defend Miles.

Dear Governor:

We wish to commend you for sending highway patrolmen to Perry last week for the protection of William Miles, Negro undertaker of Perry, who is being held on a fatal accident charge. Prompt and vigorous action like this will do much to keep mob violence at a low ebb.

We note that a white woman was killed in this accident, and we have been informed that the situation around Perry is tense. We wonder, therefore, if it will be wise to have Miles returned to Perry for trial. Bitter experience has taught us that local authorities in that section of Florida cannot always be depended upon to provide ample protection for Negro prisoners in cases of this nature. The Cullen Harrison Case in Jackson County and the Jessie James Payne Case in Madison County are concrete examples of the situation to which we refer.

To avoid a repetition of those disgraceful incidents, we respectfully urge that arrangements be made to hold the trial in some other county, as far removed from Taylor County as possible. We also urge that the prisoner be kept in the custody of highway patrolmen.

Dear Sir:

On Labor Day William Miles, Negro undertaker of Perry, was involved in a highway accident in Taylor County, in which a white woman was fatally injured. The situation around Perry was tense, and Governor Caldwell was induced to dispatch highway patrolmen to Perry to protect Miles. Miles is now at Raiford.

I am not too familiar with the details of the case, but I have been told that the accident happened primarily because a truck was parked on the highway with no tail light. It is said that a mechanic was working on the truck.

Officers of our Branch in Perry are anxious to have this case investigated. Please let me know how much you will charge to interview Miles at Raiford and ascertain the facts in the case. Or, can you do this successfully by telephone?

After you have ascertained the merits of the case, we would like to know if you will defend Miles and how much your fee will be.

Dear Rev. Clayton:

I have your letter of Sept. 8, in which you explained the case of Mr. W. H. Miles, colored undertaker of Perry, who was involved in a fatal highway accident on Labor Day. I note also that a white woman was killed in this accident and that Miles had to be sent to Raiford to avoid possible mob violence. In fact, I had read an article in the Florida Times Union last week which stated that Gov. Caldwell was induced to send highway patrolmen to Perry because of this case.

I am inclosing copy of our letter to Gov. Caldwell, in which we commend him for his prompt action. You will note also that we are asking that the trial be held in another county and that the prisoner be kept in the custody of highway patrolmen.

You also will find inclosed a copy of our letter to Atty. George E. Schefield, noted white criminal lawyer of Tavares, in which we are asking his terms to make an investigation of this matter and to serve as defense attorney. As soon as I hear from him, I shall write you again. We doubt the family will be able to provide some money for a lawyer. I would suggest that your Branch raise what you can to help provide the necessary amount. You might talk with Mrs. Miles and see if she has another lawyer in mind. I just thought of Schefield because he is working on a case for our Lake Wales Branch. If you wish it so, we can handle the matter in the name of the State Conference, and the family and the local Branch can furnish the lawyer's fee. This might help to relieve you of local pressure.

Please keep me informed of any new developments.

In reply to your letter of September 11th I wish to advise that I have no authority to grant a change of venue in the trial of William Miles. This request will have to be presented to the court in due form and the Judge will rule on the matter in accordance with the facts as they exist at that time.

There was nothing done in Taylor County to indicate that violence would have occurred, but it was decided to remove Miles from the county in an abundance of precaution. I am sure that this matter will be handled by the courts without prejudice to the defendant's securing a fair trial.

## *Patrolmen Sent To Protect Negro*

TALLAHASSEE, Sept. 4.—Governor Caldwell last night dispatched 15 State highway patrolmen to Perry to protect a negro being held on a fatal accident charge against possible violence.

The Governor said he received a call from a group of substantial citizens that an effort might be made to take the negro from the Taylor County jail.

The negro, Williams Miles, was the driver of an automobile involved in a Labor Day accident which resulted in the death of Mrs. Roda Black, 65-year-old white woman.

After the highway patrolmen arrived in Perry the negro was taken to the State prison at Tallahassee by Taylor County Sheriff J. H. Marker.

There was no report of any violence.

Dear Mr. Williams:



In order that such a project would not be too expensive, the itinerary would have to be arranged to include visitations to other branches presently operating which could pay some of the expenses of these visits. We are asking you or the state organizer to outline a tentative itinerary including dates, branches


and areas which could be organized.
